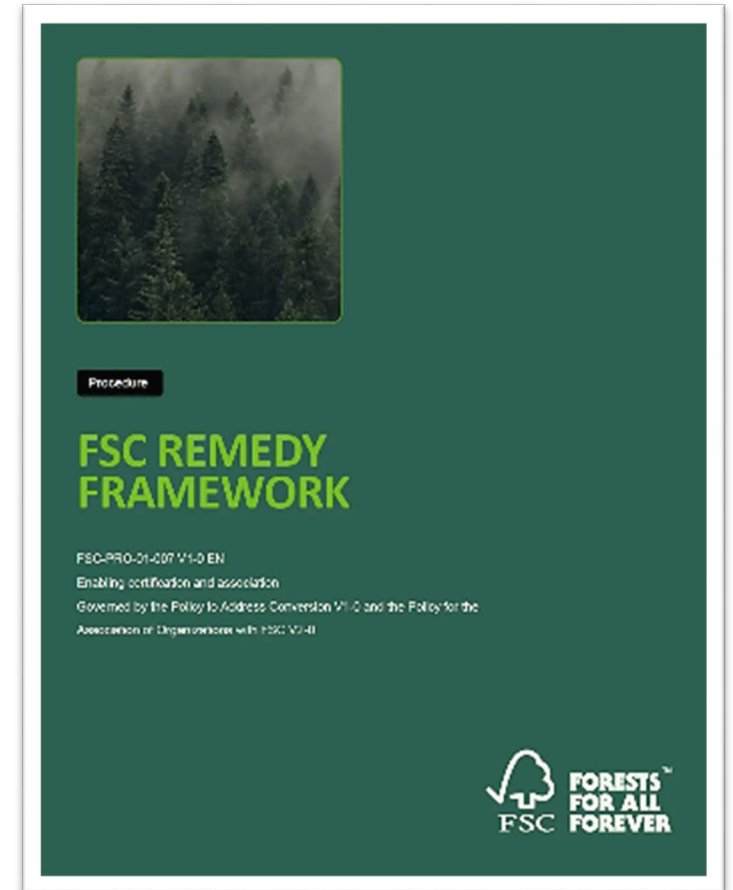

APRIL Engagement with FSC Remedy Process

- Disassociated in 2013 from FSC because of FSC cut-off date for plantation establishment
- Engaged in a dialogue with FSC since 2016
- Environmental and social baseline assessments conducted in 2020
- FSC Remedy Framework became effective from July 2023
- Signed a remedy framework agreement (**Memorandum of Understanding**) with FSC in November 2023 to start the implementation of APRIL's remedy process
- APRIL's remedy plan is being developed and will be implemented according to the FSC Remedy Framework
- APRIL- first to implement the Remedy Framework

Why Engage in FSC Remedy?

- **Indonesia deserves to be recognized globally as among the best and largest in plantation forestry and manufacturing**
 - Indonesia forestry sector operates to global standards
- **Fair market access for Indonesian pulp and paper products**
- **Opportunities for collective win-win:**
 - **Address past negative impacts** of APRIL's operations primarily from the conversion of forests to plantations
 - Remedy past environmental and social harms from 1994
 - **Deliver positive outcomes**
 - Environment: Significant, additional forest conservation and restoration areas; landscape management; support to national parks; partnerships with conservation NGOs on ERCs or species conservation initiatives
 - Social – Access to land and resources; community-managed forestry; partnerships on sustainable agriculture or agro-forestry; resolution of land disputes
 - Government –contribution to climate targets
