# Stakeholder Forum - Ground Rules

## (Tata Tertib)

# Stakeholder Forum - Ground rules (Tata Tertib)

# Forum objectives (reminder)

- Facilitate shared understanding among stakeholders of the APRIL FSC remedy process.
- Encourage awareness of the opportunities for positive outcomes that could result from the remedy process for rightsholders, stakeholders and more broadly for Indonesia's forest conservation and social development.
- Gather input from participants to strengthen the APRIL FSC remedy process and the achievement of important environmental and social remedy.

# APRIL highlights

- **An opportunity for a collective win-win** for forest conservation, restoration, new partnerships with communities, access to land and resources, capacity building and dispute resolution.
- **This is being done for the first time in the world** and APRIL wants to listen to your input and strengthen the APRIL FSC remedy process with your support and engagement.
- **It helps transform the APRIL Group**, resolving historical issues, building partnership and trust.
- This process **ensures Indonesia is recognized globally** as a leader in plantation forestry and manufacturing, with fair market access, and minimizing the possibility that harms could happen again.

# FSC highlights

- **Remedy is all encompassing...**covering conservation, restoration, restitution and compensation to communities that have suffered harm through conversion and unacceptable activities.
- Our objective is to **achieve high-quality and meaningful environmental and social benefits.**
- **FSC wants to listen and learn.**

# FPP and WWF-Indonesia highlights

## **FPP:**

Remedy should be provided for all violations of human and customary rights, 1994-2000, associated with deforestation.

Such remedy must be provided by all operations in the corporate group.

## **WWF-Indonesia:**

WWF worked from 2011 to 2022 to get FSC to allow for remedy and reassociation.

Remediation covers a 26-year period, **it is a very serious commitment**, and especially significant for Sumatra, home for many flagship endangered species

# Quotes from participants

"Interpret the remedy framework into a practical process, to get beyond confusion."

"I experienced violations to HR firsthand and hope we can come up with solution."

"It's not complete if government is not invited, they should be for the next event"

"Many people put a lot of work into this and have expectations it will achieve something for harmed communities and forests, high expectations this will deliver these gains, but I have major concerns about the process and would like those to be heard and addressed."

# Quotes from participants

"I hope reviewing social conflict ensures voices are heard that are not pro-company, ensuring APRIL listens and hears these voices and ensures the rights are taken care of. We need review with a participatory approach, so all pro and contra voices are heard. APRIL policies are OK on paper but in the field a lot needs to be discussed."

"The remedy framework is very important, and mediation is not a quick process. Needs to be more than restitution, not just returning land that is damaged or with uncertain tenure."

"Power relations need to be considered and that will take time."

"We can only regret the past, best is to change direction through remediation, this is a big first step to realizing the remedy framework so that Indonesia can be a good forestry country."
